Brake Pads

Brakes are vital to the safe operation of the vehicle, so it is important that brakes are inspected and maintained on a regular basis.

Upon inspection of your vehicle by a Ford-trained technician, we have determined your brake pads are "**in the red**" as indicated on your Vehicle Report Card.

WHAT DOES THIS MEAN?

Brake pads that are found to be "**in the red**" (< 3mm in thickness) require immediate attention.

Worn brakes may:

- contribute to longer stopping distances
- damage other components of your braking system, including the rotors leading to costly repairs
- lead to uneven wear on tires from having to slam on brakes

EXPERT TIP

If the rotors or drums have been identified as being **"in the yellow"** (drums – 1-2 mm; rotors 3-5 mm lining remaining), consider changing them with your brake pads. Because your vehicle is already on the hoist, you can help save time and labour costs by doing them at the same time!
